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MARSABIT COUNTY WEEKLY WEATHER FORECAST

VALID: 2nd to 8th June 2026.

Date of issue: Monday 1st June 2026

Marsabit County Weather Outlook (2nd – 8th June 2026)

Most parts of Marsabit County are expected to remain generally dry during the forecast period of 2nd – 8th June 2026. Any rainfall that occurs is likely to be confined to a few isolated areas along the Ethiopia border, parts of Mt. Marsabit, Sololo, and localized pockets near Maikona. Most interior, lowland, and desert areas are expected to receive no rainfall, while isolated locations may record only trace amounts to less than 3 mm.

1. Marsabit Central & Saku (Marsabit Town, Sagante/Jaldesa, Karare)

Most parts of Marsabit Town, Karare, and surrounding plains are expected to remain generally dry throughout the forecast period.

Isolated areas around Mt. Marsabit and Sagante/Jaldesa may receive light rainfall ranging between trace amounts and 3 mm, while most surrounding areas are likely to remain dry.

Foggy conditions are expected to persist around Mt. Marsabit during the mornings and late evenings, occasionally reducing visibility.

Wind Forecast

Moderate to occasionally fresh winds of about 15–25 knots are expected across most areas, with occasional stronger gusts.

2. North Horr (North Horr, Dukana, Maikona)

Most parts of North Horr, Dukana, and Maikona are expected to remain hot and dry.

Only a few isolated locations near the Ethiopia border and around Maikona may receive light rainfall of less than 3 mm, while the majority of the area is likely to record no rainfall.

Wind Forecast

Strong winds ranging between 20–30 knots with occasional stronger gusts are expected across most parts of the sub-county.

3. Laisamis (Laisamis, Logologo, Korrr/Ngurunit)

Laisamis, Logologo, Korrr, and Ngurunit are expected to experience predominantly dry weather conditions throughout the forecast period.

Wind Forecast

Moderate to strong winds of approximately 15–25 knots are expected across much of the sub-county.

4. Moyale Sub-County (Sololo, Uran, Obbu, Butiye)

Most parts of Moyale Sub-County are expected to remain generally dry.

Isolated areas around Sololo and sections bordering Ethiopia may receive light rainfall ranging between 1 mm and 3 mm, while Uran, Obbu, and Butiye are expected to remain largely dry with only a slight chance of brief showers.

Wind Forecast

Moderate to occasionally strong winds of about 15–25 knots are expected, with occasional gusts exceeding 30 knots.

5. Turbi & Surrounding Areas

Mainly dry, sunny, and warm weather conditions are expected throughout the forecast period.

No significant rainfall is anticipated across the area.

Wind Forecast

Fresh winds ranging between 18–28 knots are expected, with stronger gusty crosswinds likely over exposed dry areas.

6. Loiyangalani (Lake Turkana Belt)

The Lake Turkana Belt is expected to remain predominantly dry.

Only isolated locations may experience very light showers of less than 2 mm, with most areas receiving no rainfall.

Hot, windy, and generally dry weather conditions are expected to dominate throughout the week.

Wind Forecast

Very strong and persistent winds of approximately 25–40 knots are expected along the Lake Turkana corridor, particularly during afternoons and evenings. Rough lake conditions, blowing dust, and occasional reductions in visibility may occur.

7. Kargi / South Horr

Kargi and South Horr are expected to experience generally hot and dry weather conditions throughout the forecast period.

Most locations are likely to remain dry, although isolated elevated areas may experience brief light showers of less than 2 mm.

Wind Forecast

Strong winds of 20–30 knots are expected, accompanied by occasional dusty conditions.

Marsabit County Temperature Summary (2nd – 8th June 2026)

Marsabit County is expected to experience generally warm to hot weather conditions during the forecast period, with relatively cooler temperatures over the highland and elevated areas around Mt. Marsabit, Sololo, and Korr/Ngurunit. Most lowland and desert areas will remain hot during the day and relatively warm at night.

Maximum Temperatures

Daytime temperatures are expected to range between approximately 24°C and 39°C across the county.

- Cooler daytime temperatures (24°C–29°C) are expected around Mt. Marsabit, Sololo, and elevated parts of Korr/Ngurunit due to cloud cover and highland influence.
- Moderate temperatures (29°C–34°C) are expected across Marsabit Town, Moyale, Turbi, and surrounding central areas.
- Hot conditions (34°C–39°C) are likely across Illeret, North Horr, Loiyangalani, Maikona, and other lowland desert areas.

Minimum Temperatures

Night-time temperatures are expected to range between approximately 12°C and 28°C across the county.

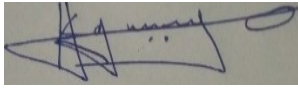
- The coolest nights (12°C–16°C) are expected over the higher elevation areas of Korr/Ngurunit, parts of Laisamis, isolated sections around Mt. Marsabit, and elevated areas near Sololo.
- Mild night-time temperatures (16°C–24°C) are expected across much of Marsabit Central, Moyale, Turbi, and surrounding regions.
- Warmer nights (24°C–28°C) are likely over Illeret, North Horr, Loiyangalani, Maikona, and other low-lying northern and lakeside areas.

Advisory

- Communities in Loiyangalani, North Horr, Kargi, and the Lake Turkana belt should remain alert to strong winds, blowing dust, and occasional reductions in visibility.
- Livestock keepers are encouraged to conserve available water resources as dry conditions are expected to persist across most parts of the county.
- Farmers should not rely on the isolated light showers for significant soil moisture improvement, as rainfall amounts are expected to be minimal and localized.
- Lake users along Lake Turkana are advised to exercise caution due to rough lake conditions associated with persistent strong winds.

Residents are advised to follow weather updates and warnings issued by the Kenya Meteorological Department throughout the forecast period.
