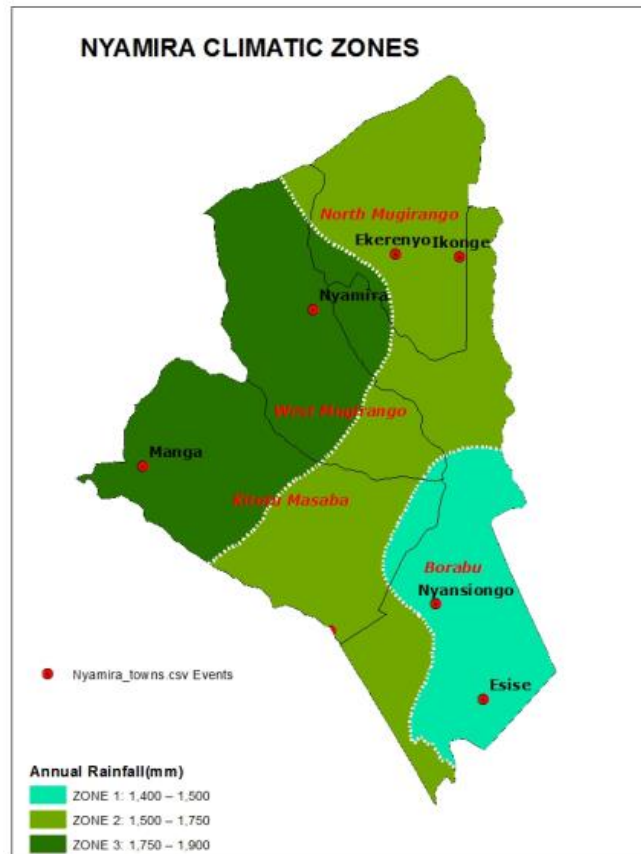


Figure 1: Nyamira climate zones

County Weekly Weather & Safety Guide

1. Precipitation Forecast

Morning: **Zone 1:** Rainfall expected Thursday, Friday, and Sunday. **Zone 2:** Rainfall expected Friday and Monday. **Zone 3:** Rainfall expected daily from Thursday to Monday.

Afternoon & Evening: **Zones 1 & 2:** Daily showers and thunderstorms expected all week. **Zone 3:** Daily showers and thunderstorms expected Tuesday through Sunday.

2. Temperature

- **Daytime:** Highs between 21°C and 26°C.
- **Nighttime:** Lows between 12°C and 16°C.

3. Safety & Strategy: Essential Guidelines

i. Agriculture and Livestock Sector

- **Crop Protection:** Excavate deep drainage trenches around crop fields to prevent waterlogging and root rot.
- **Fertilizer Application:** Postpone top-dressing fertilizer applications to avoid nutrient leaching.
- **Livestock Health:** Vaccinate all cattle and small ruminants against Rift Valley Fever and foot rot.
- **Hoof Disease Prevention:** House livestock on elevated, dry, or slatted flooring to prevent hoof infections.
- **Technical Extension:** Consult the County Department of Agriculture for localized seed and crop advisories.

ii. Health Sector

- **Water Safety:** Boil or chemically treat all drinking water to eliminate waterborne pathogens.
- **Malaria Prevention:** Utilize insecticide-treated mosquito nets to mitigate any malaria cases.
- **Early Reporting:** Report initial symptoms of cholera, typhoid, or dysentery to the nearest health facility immediately.

- **Sanitation:** Ensure household pit latrines remain covered to prevent the contamination of surface water.
- **Vector Control:** Drain stagnant water accumulations around homesteads to eliminate mosquito breeding sites.

iii. Environment Sector

- **Erosion Control:** Plant deep-rooted cover crops on bare terrain to mitigate topsoil erosion.
- **Waste Management:** Refrain from dumping waste into open drainage channels to prevent severe blockages.
- **Riparian Protection:** Preserve riparian boundaries by restricting livestock access to fragile riverbanks.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Report incidents of localized environmental degradation or illegal logging to the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA).

iv. Lightning Strike Mitigation

- **Safe Shelter:** Avoid seeking shelter under tall or isolated trees during afternoon thunderstorms.
- **Evacuation:** Vacate open fields and elevated ridges immediately upon the gathering of storm clouds.

v. Business Sector

- **Asset Protection:** Elevate high-value stock and electronic equipment onto raised shelving units.
- **Infrastructure Maintenance:** Inspect and repair commercial roofs to safeguard inventory from water damage.

vi. Landslide and Mudslide Mitigation

- **Early Warning:** Monitor terrain for indicators of instability, such as tilting trees or sudden ground cracks.
- **Runoff Management:** Construct temporary drainage diversions away from steep slopes to reduce soil saturation.
- **Emergency Response:** Cooperate fully with county emergency response teams and the Kenya Red Cross Society during evacuations.

vii. Road Safety

- **Speed Reduction:** Reduce driving speeds significantly on wet roadways to prevent swerving.
- **Flood Crossing:** Do not attempt to drive or walk through moving floodwaters under any circumstances.
- **Defensive Driving:** Maintain an extended following distance from preceding vehicles due to compromised visibility.
- **Visibility:** Keep headlights illuminated during heavy afternoon downpours to ensure visibility to oncoming traffic.

viii. Education and Schools Sector

- **Structural Audits:** Conduct daily inspections of classroom roofs, latrines, and fences for structural hazards.
- **Commute Safety:** Ensure learners do not attempt to cross swollen rivers or flooded terrains en route to school.
- **Emergency Protocols:** Designate secure, elevated assembly points within school compounds for emergency situations.

APPENDIX I: INTERPRETATION OF TERMS USED

Term	Rainfall Amount (24 hrs.)	Description
Light	< 5 mm	Gentle rain, drizzle.
Moderate	5–20 mm	Steady, noticeable rain.
Heavy	21–50 mm	Intense rain, possible thunder.
Very Heavy	> 50 mm	Prolonged rain, high intensity.

Term	Area Affected	Description
Few places	< 33%	Rain in a small portion of the region.
Several places	33% to 66%	Rain in multiple but not most parts of the region.
Most places	> 66%	Rain in nearly all parts of the region.

Term	Area Affected	Description
Isolated	Less than 25%	Very few areas affected.
Scattered	25–50%	Several, but not most, areas affected.
Numerous	51–70%	Many areas affected.
Widespread	Over 70%	Almost all areas affected.

Term	Time Coverage (%)	Meaning
Occasional	Less than 25%	Happens rarely or a few times.
Intermittent	25% – 50%	Starts and stops, comes and goes.
Frequent	51% – 75%	Occurs regularly.
Very Frequent / Common	More than 75%	Happens almost all the time.

Term	Probability of Occurrence	Description
Possible	10–30%	There is low confidence.
Chance of/ May	31–50%	There is moderate confidence.
Likely	51–75%	The event is more probable than not.
Expected	76–90%	There is high confidence.
Very Likely	91–99%	There is very high confidence. Almost certain.
Certain	100%	The event is guaranteed to occur.
