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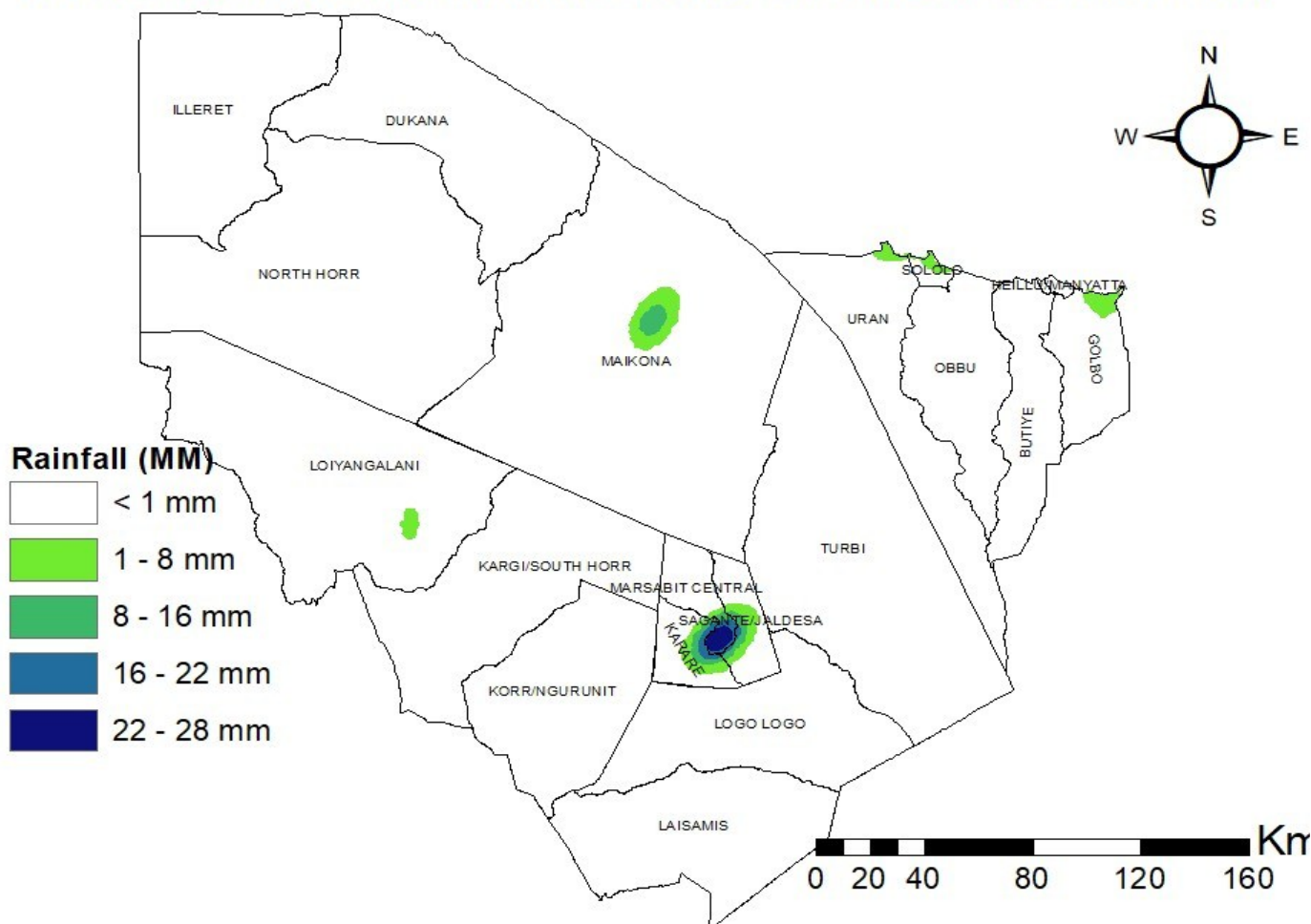

MARSABIT COUNTY WEEKLY WEATHER FORECAST

WEEKLY ACCUMULATION RAINFALL FORECAST VALID 16 TO 22 JUNE 2026



Marsabit County Weather Outlook (16th – 22nd June 2026)

Most parts of Marsabit County are expected to remain generally dry during the forecast period of 16th – 22nd June 2026. Any rainfall that occurs is likely to be confined to a few isolated areas along the Ethiopia border, parts of Mt. Marsabit, Sololo, and localized pockets around Korr and Ngurunit. Most interior, lowland, and desert areas are expected to receive little or no rainfall.

1. Marsabit Central & Saku (Marsabit Town, Sagante/Jaldesa, Karare)

Most parts of Marsabit Town, Karare, and the surrounding plains are expected to remain predominantly dry throughout the forecast period.

Localized light showers ranging between trace amounts and 2 mm may occur around Mt. Marsabit and Sagante/Jaldesa, while most surrounding areas are likely to remain dry.

Morning fog and low cloud cover are expected to persist around Mt. Marsabit, occasionally reducing visibility during early morning and evening hours.

Wind Forecast

Moderate to strong winds of approximately 15–25 knots are expected across most areas, with occasional stronger gusts.

2. North Horr (North Horr, Dukana, Maikona)

North Horr, Dukana, and Maikona are expected to remain hot and predominantly dry.

A few isolated locations near the Ethiopia border may experience very light showers of less than 2 mm, but most areas are likely to receive no rainfall.

Wind Forecast

Strong winds ranging between 20–30 knots, accompanied by occasional stronger gusts, are expected across much of the sub-county.

3. Laisamis (Laisamis, Logologo, Korr/Ngurunit)

Laisamis, Logologo, Korr, and Ngurunit are expected to experience mainly dry weather conditions.

Morning cloudiness and occasional mist are likely over Korr and Ngurunit, with isolated light showers of less than 3 mm possible over higher elevations.

Wind Forecast

Moderate to strong winds of approximately 15–25 knots are expected across much of the sub-county.

4. Moyale Sub-County (Sololo, Uran, Obbu, Butiye)

Most parts of Moyale Sub-County are expected to remain generally dry.

Isolated areas around Sololo and sections bordering Ethiopia may receive light rainfall ranging between 1 mm and 3 mm. Uran, Obbu, and Butiye are expected to remain largely dry with only a slight chance of brief showers.

Wind Forecast

Moderate to occasionally strong winds of about 15–25 knots are expected, with occasional gusts exceeding 30 knots.

5. Turbi & Surrounding Areas

Mainly dry, sunny, and warm weather conditions are expected throughout the forecast period.

Wind Forecast

Strong winds ranging between 18–28 knots are expected, with occasional gusty crosswinds over exposed areas.

6. Loiyangalani (Lake Turkana Belt)

The Lake Turkana Belt is expected to remain predominantly dry.

Most areas are likely to receive no rainfall, although isolated locations may experience brief light showers of less than 2 mm.

Hot, windy, and generally dry conditions are expected to prevail throughout the week.

Wind Forecast

Very strong and persistent winds of approximately 25–40 knots are expected along the Lake Turkana corridor, especially during afternoons and evenings. Rough lake conditions, blowing dust, and reduced visibility are likely at times.

7. Kargi / South Horr

Kargi and South Horr are expected to experience generally hot and dry weather conditions.

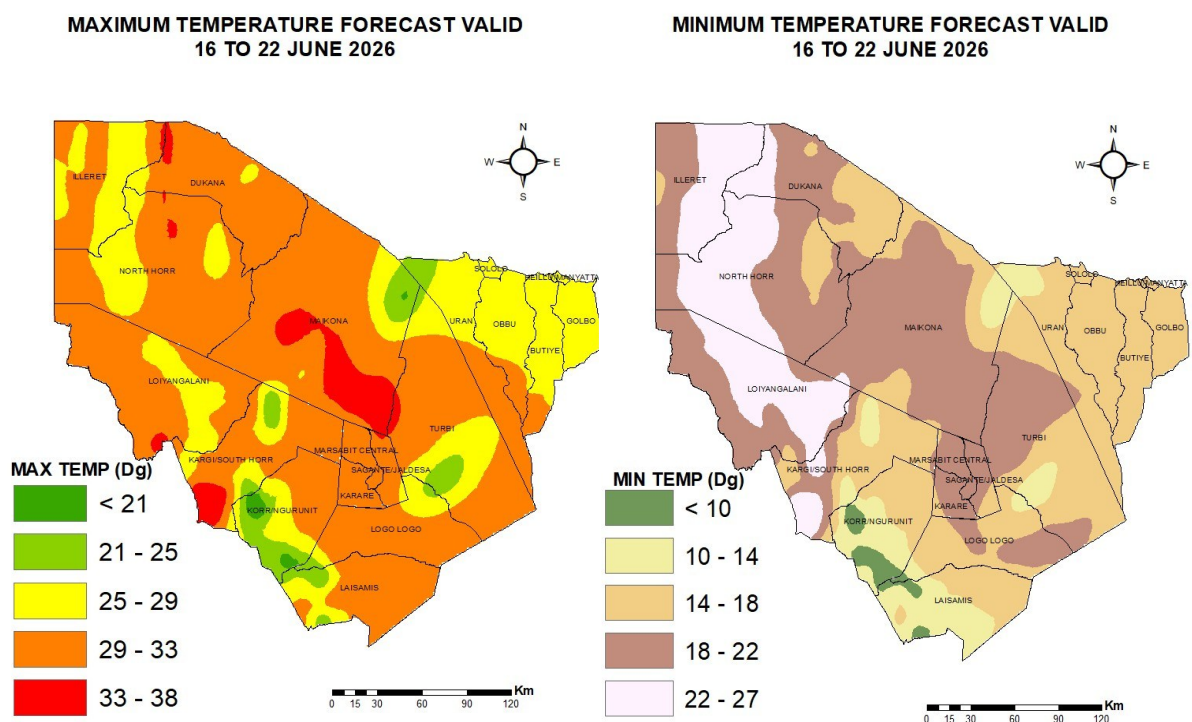
Most locations are likely to remain dry, although isolated elevated areas may experience brief light showers of less than 2 mm.

Wind Forecast

Strong winds of 20–30 knots are expected, accompanied by occasional dusty conditions.

Marsabit County Temperature Summary (16th – 22nd June 2026)

Marsabit County is expected to experience generally warm to hot weather conditions during the forecast period, with relatively cooler temperatures over the highland and elevated areas around Mt. Marsabit, Sololo, Hurri hills and Korr/Ngurunit.



Maximum Temperatures

Daytime temperatures are expected to range between approximately **24°C and 38°C** across the county.

- Cooler daytime temperatures (24°C–29°C) are expected around Mt. Marsabit, Sololo, and elevated parts of Korri/Ngurunit.
- Moderate temperatures (29°C–34°C) are expected across Marsabit Town, Moyale, Turbi, and surrounding central areas.
- Hot conditions (34°C–38°C) are likely across Illeret, North Horr, Loiyangalani, Maikona, and other lowland desert areas.

Minimum Temperatures

Night-time temperatures are expected to range between approximately 12°C and 27°C across the county.

- The coolest nights (10°C–16°C) are expected over Korri/Ngurunit, parts of Laisamis, Mt. Marsabit, Hurri hills and elevated sections of Sololo.
- Mild night-time temperatures (16°C–23°C) are expected across much of Marsabit Central, Moyale, Turbi, and surrounding areas.
- Warmer nights (23°C–27°C) are likely over Illeret, North Horr, Loiyangalani, Maikona, and other low-lying northern and lakeside areas.

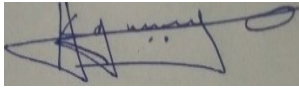
Advisory

- Communities in Loiyangalani, North Horr, Kargi, and the Lake Turkana belt should remain alert to strong winds, blowing dust, and occasional reductions in visibility.
- Livestock keepers are encouraged to continue conserving available water resources as dry conditions are expected to persist across most parts of the county.
- Lake users along Lake Turkana are advised to exercise caution due to rough lake conditions associated with persistent strong winds.
- Residents are encouraged to take precautions against heat stress, particularly in the lowland areas where daytime temperatures are expected to remain high.
- Motorists operating along the Marsabit–Moyale, Loiyangalani–South Horr, and North Horr road corridors should exercise caution due to occasional dust and reduced visibility caused by strong winds.

This version maintains continuity from the previous week's outlook while reflecting a slightly lower probability of rainfall and continued strong wind conditions typical of mid-June across Marsabit County.

Residents are advised to follow weather updates and warnings issued by the Kenya Meteorological Department throughout the forecast period.
