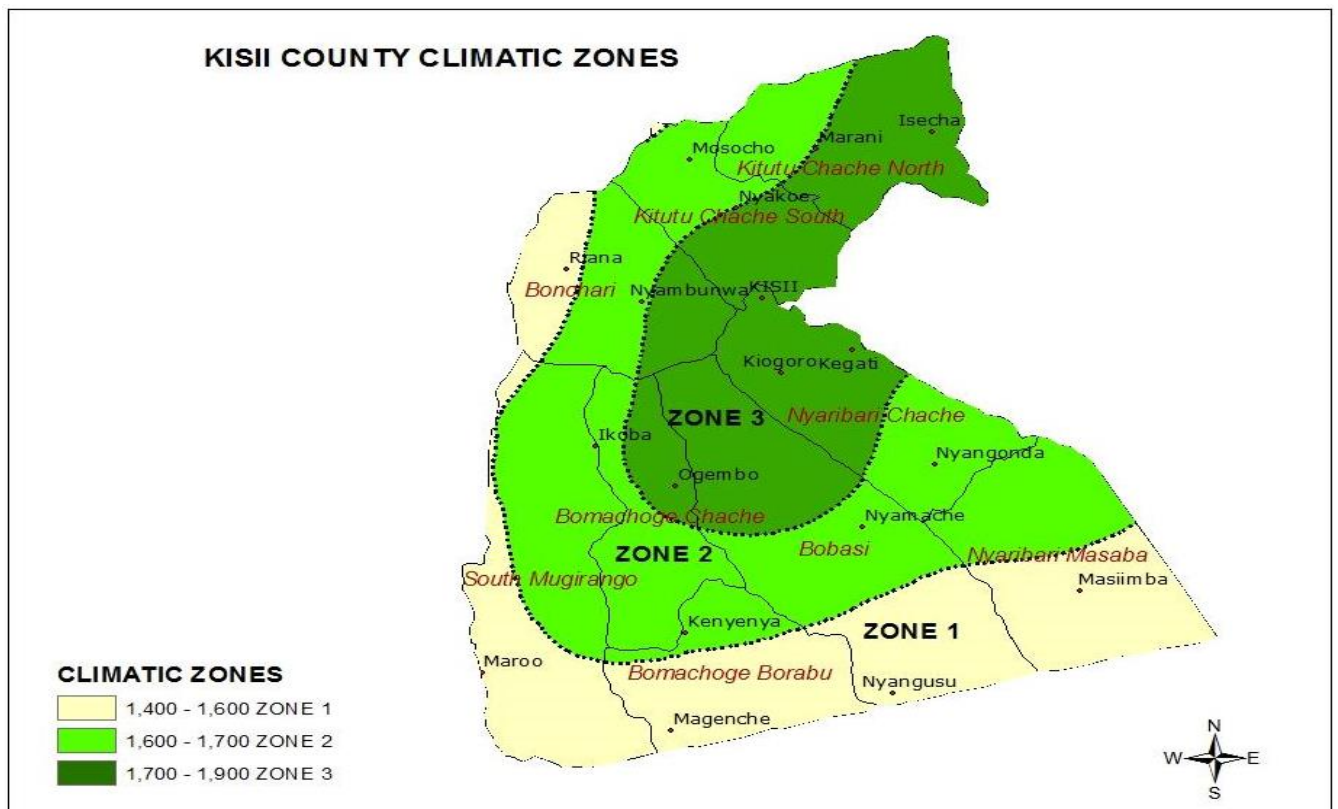
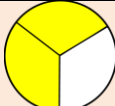
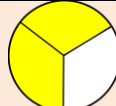


Figure 1: Kisii climatic zones

Kisii County: Weekly Forecast & Safety

1. Weather Forecast: *Rainfall is expected to continue through the week.*

(i) Morning Rain. Zones 1, 2, and 3: Light to moderate rainfall is projected from Saturday through Monday.

(ii) Afternoon & Evening Storms in Zones 1, 2, and 3: Scattered showers and thunderstorms are anticipated daily throughout the week, with the exception of Tuesday.

2. Temperature

- i. **Daytime (Max.)** Temperatures: (20°C - 29°C).
- ii. **Nighttime (Min.)** Temperatures: (11°C - 18°C)

3. SAFETY & STRATEGY: ESSENTIAL GUIDELINES-

i) Agriculture and Livestock Sector

- Dig deep drainage trenches around crop fields to prevent waterlogging and root rot.
- Vaccinate all cattle and small ruminants against Rift Valley Fever and foot rot and other weather related sicknesses, and continue monitoring herds closely for foot rot, pneumonia, and rift valley fever.
- Keep livestock on raised, dry, or slatted floors to prevent hoof infections.
- Consult the County Department of Agriculture for localized seed and crop guidance.

ii) Health Sector

- **Waterborne Diseases:** Treat all drinking water due to high risks of contamination.
- **Vector Control:** Clear stagnant water pools around homes to prevent mosquito breeding.
- **Medical Supplies:** Stockpile essential cholera kits, antimalarial, and water purification tablets.
- **Pit Latrines:** Residents are advised to use sealed covers on all household pit latrines to prevent the surface runoff of faecal contaminants into open water systems.

iii) Lightning Strikes

- Residents are advised to avoid seeking shelter under tall or isolated trees during afternoon thunderstorms.
- Residents to avoid handling electrical appliances or metallic objects while it is raining.
- Residents are advised to get out of open farm fields and elevated ridges as soon as clouds gather.
- **Infrastructure:** Residents are advised to install lightning arrestors on all tall public and private buildings.

iv) Landslides and Mudslides

- Watch for warning signs like tilting trees or sudden cracks in the ground.
- Create temporary drainage diversions away from steep hill bases to minimize saturation.
- Cooperate with county emergency teams and the Kenya Red Cross during evacuations.

v) Business Sector

- **Supply Chains:** Diversify sourcing paths to avoid delays caused by washed-out roads.
- **Inventory Protection:** Move valuable stock and documents to upper floors or waterproof containers.
- Inspect and repair business premise roofs to safeguard inventory from leakage.

vi) Road Safety

- Reduce driving speeds significantly on wet roads to maintain tire grip.
- **Flooded Roads:** Never attempt to drive or walk through moving floodwaters.
- **Visibility:** Turn on headlights during heavy downpours and maintain safe following distances.
- Keep headlights on during heavy afternoon downpours to remain visible to others

vii) Education and Schools Sector

- **Structural Audits:** Inspect school roofs, latrines, and walls for structural integrity.
- **Swollen rivers or flooded plains:** Ensure learners do not cross swollen rivers or flooded plains on their way to school.
- **Student Safety:** Keep children indoors during storms; do not release them alone.

- Designate safe, elevated assembly points within school compounds for emergencies.

viii) Environment and Forestry Sector

- **Siltation Control:** Deploy silt fences near rivers to stop eroded soil from choking waterways, and Plant deep-rooted cover crops on bare ground to prevent topsoil erosion.
- **Tree Hazards:** Prune weak, heavy branches near power lines and roads before windstorms.
- **Wetland Protection:** Enforce strict bans on dumping waste into natural drainage basins.
- Maintain riparian boundaries by keeping livestock away from fragile river banks.
- Report localized environmental degradation or illegal logging to the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA).

APPENDIX I: INTERPRETATION OF TERMS USED

Term	Rainfall Amount (24 hrs.)	Description
Light	< 5 mm	Gentle rain, drizzle.
Moderate	5–20 mm	Steady, noticeable rain.
Heavy	21–50 mm	Intense rain, possible thunder.
Very Heavy	> 50 mm	Prolonged rain, high intensity.

Term	Area Affected	Description
Few places	< 33%	Rain in a small portion of the region.
Several places	33% to 66%	Rain in multiple but not most parts of the region.
Most places	> 66%	Rain in nearly all parts of the region.

Term	Area Affected	Description
Isolated	Less than 25%	Very few areas affected.
Scattered	25–50%	Several, but not most, areas affected.
Numerous	51–70%	Many areas affected.
Widespread	Over 70%	Almost all areas affected.

Term	Time Coverage (%)	Meaning
Occasional	Less than 25%	Happens rarely or a few times.
Intermittent	25% – 50%	Starts and stops, comes and goes.
Frequent	51% – 75%	Occurs regularly.
Very Frequent / Common	More than 75%	Happens almost all the time.

Possible	10–30%	There is low confidence.
