Date of issue: Monday 27TH DECEMBER, 2021




Fig 1. Weekly weather forecast precipitation totals 28^{th} Dec 2021 to 3^{rd} January 2022 and Weekly weather observed precipitation totals 21^{st} to 27^{th} Dec 2021

POTENTIAL IMPACTS

The following are the likely impacts during the month of December 2021:

Agriculture and Food Security

The expected rainfall during the fourth week of the month over County is likely to improve the food security in these areas as water and pasture will be rejuvenated.

Disaster Management

Where isolated storms are likely, flash floods are likely to occur. This may result in loss of lives and property.

Water Resources Management and Energy

The rainfall is expected to continue in the fourth week of the month; hence residents are encouraged to harvest rain and runoffs for consumption.

Environment

December marks the end of the short rains season over Kitui. However, the occasional rainfall expected over several parts of the County is likely to maintain conducive soil moisture to sustain tree growth. The public should therefore take advantage of these conditions to plant more trees in order to mitigate Climate Change. Further, they should put sustainable measures in place to conserve the environment.

Health

Malnutrition related diseases are likely to escalate in the ASAL parts of the County. Relevant authorities should put plans in place to provide food and food supplements to the most affected communities.

Transport and Public Safety Sector

The expected occasional rainfall especially during the fourth week of the month may cause slippery roads in some parts of the County increasing the risk of accidents. Flash floods may cause transport challenges on poorly drained roads and more so in areas where the roads become impassable when it rains.

Summary

Light to moderate morning rains as well as afternoon and night shower are likely to occur over several places from Tuesday to Thursday this week reducing to light or no rain from Friday till the end of the forecast period. Maximum (day time) temperatures are likely to range from 24°C to 31°C while minimum (Night time) temperatures are expected to be between 16°C and 24°C.

Note: 1 mm of rainfall is equivalent to 1 litre of rainfall per square meter.
