SEVEN-DAY WEATHER FORECAST VALID 22ND TO 28TH APRIL 2025

HIGHLIGHTS

Forecast for 22nd to 28th April 2025

Rainfall is expected to continue over the county with a reduction in amounts and intensities during the forecast period.

Isolated heavy rainfall events are expected over some parts of the county.

Weather Review 14th to 20th April 2025

- Rainfall was recorded over several parts of the county during the review period.
- Koromangucha Rainfall station recorded the highest weekly cumulative rainfall total of 131.0mm.




Figure 2: 7day cumulative rainfall forecast valid 22-28 April 2025

The county will continue to receive rainfall amounts with a reduction in amounts and intensities during the forecast period. Most parts of county are expected to receive more than 20mm weekly cumulative rainfall (Figure 2)




Figure 3: Maximum Temperature forecast 22-28 April 2025

The day-time and tight time temperatures will reduce during the period as shown in Figure 3 and 4.

Commentary of County Weather forecaster:

- Sunny intervals are expected in the mornings though rains may occur over few places. Afternoon showers and thunderstorms are likely to occur over several places during the first half of the forecast period reducing to few places towards the end. Occasional night showers are expected over a few places.
- Daytime temperatures are expected to range from 22°C to 28°C and night time temperatures to range from 15°C to 18°C.



Commentary of County Weather forecaster:

• Sunny intervals are expected in the mornings though rains may occur over few places. Afternoon showers and thunderstorms are likely to occur over several places during the first half of the forecast period reducing to few places towards the end. Occasional night showers are expected over a few places.

Daytime temperatures are expected to range from 23°C to 29°C and night time temperatures to range from 16°C to 21°C.

Weather Review for 14th to 20th April 2025



- Rainfall was recorded over several parts of the county during the review period.
- Koromangucha Rainfall station recorded the highest weekly cumulative rainfall amount of 131.0mm and also recording the highest amount within 24-hour period of 55.2mm on 19th April 2025. Other stations that recorded significant rainfall are Miyare (88.2mm); Lower Kuja Irrigation Scheme-Nyakweri AWS (57.2mm); Kituka (36.4mm); Lela AWS (31.9mm); Nyaroya (31.1mm); while the rest of the stations recorded less than 30mm.
